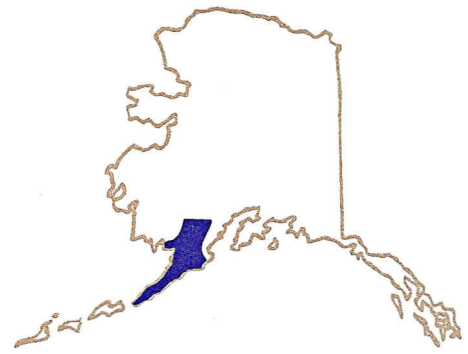

Re: Weekly Update – Oct 12 thru Oct 16

Many of you have likely already heard of the positive case in one of our communities. Contact tracing and testing is underway and the community is taking the necessary steps to prevent community transmission. This is an important reminder to remember to always:

**Do the 3 W's:** Wear your mask; Wash your hands; Watch your distance between others; and

**Avoid the 3 C's:** Crowded places; Close contact; Confined spaces

We have attached a flyer to this memo that you can print and post around your community.

BBEDC recently released updated information on COVID-19 relief funding opportunities. We have attached the updated table to this memo for your convenience.

Local fishermen should keep an eye on two funding sources in particular: ADF&G's (Section 12005) CARES Act relief funding for fishery participants, and USDA's Seafood Trade Relief Program.

The application period for ADF&G's (Section 12005) CARES Act relief funding for fishery participants has not yet opened, but ADF&G recently released the [Draft Spend Plan](#). Public comment closes October 19 at 6pm, and updated guidance and FAQs on this funding source are available [here](#).

Under USDA's Seafood Trade Relief Program, salmon fishermen are eligible to receive .16/lb. for salmon harvested in 2019. This is not a first-come-first-serve process. Be sure to apply. Applications are available [here](#) and open Sep 14 - Dec 14. Fishermen should apply through their local USDA Service Center. Bristol Bay is served by the USDA's Palmer office. # Avoid the Three Cs

Be aware of different levels of risk in different settings.

There are certain places where COVID-19 spreads more easily:



## Crowded places

*with many people nearby*



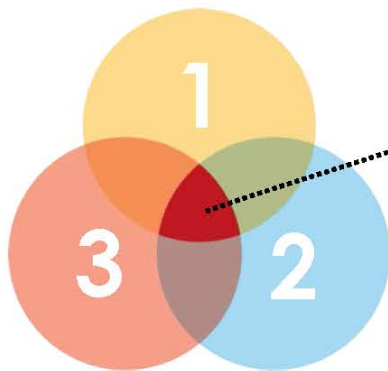
## Close-contact settings

*Especially where people have close-range conversations*



## Confined and enclosed spaces

*with poor ventilation*



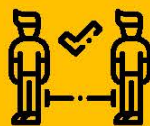
The risk is higher in places where these factors overlap.

**Even as restrictions are lifted, consider where you are going and #StaySafe by avoiding the Three Cs.**

## WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?



Avoid crowded places and limit time in enclosed spaces



Maintain at least 1m distance from others



When possible, open windows and doors for ventilation



Keep hands clean and cover coughs and sneezes



Wear a mask if requested or if physical distancing is not possible

**If you are unwell, stay home unless to seek urgent medical care.**
